#### 2020-2021 DUES NOTICE FROM YOUR LODGE SECRETARY \* \*

#### Your 2020-2021 Lodge Dues will be increased by the Grand Lodge and State Assessments

Our Annual Dues will be remain at \$125.00. The Grand Lodge Assessment of \$19 and the State Assessment of \$3 will be added to the total that will be due on April 1. The Lodge had been absorbing those Assessments for you for the last ten years, but we can no longer afford to do that. Per our By-Laws, Article X; Section 2(b) it states that each members pays the Regular Lodge dues of \$125 plus the Annual G/L and State assessments. That total amount due on April 1, 2020 will be \$147.00 from our Regular

Members. Our Life Members and Honorary Life Members will also be assessed the \$22 which will be added to their dues.

We are looking forward to another stellar year at the St Pete Elks. I know our Community Works will continue to make you Proud To Be a St Pete Elk. Thank you for ALL YOUR SUPPORT! #### GIVING HELP AND HOPE **Assistance For Worthy Needy Members**

Needy Elks Members can qualify for up to \$1,000 in an emergency 50-50 matching grant from the Order under Statutes Section 5.070.

The assistance would be available to "worthy and needy Members of the Order who are suffering from diseases of an incurable character or from total disability, and who are without funds or property or relatives able or willing to care for them," the Statute states.

The Statute also provides that the Lodge of the assisted Member "shall contribute toward the relief of the Member an amount not less than one-half of the sum that is contributed by the Order."

The assistance program is administered by the Board of Grand Trustees, which is authorized to appropriate up to \$10,000 annually for the program. The board by resolution may give the Grand Exalted Ruler up to \$1,000 so that authorized payments may be made regularly by him.

"The monies so appropriated shall be administered by the Grand Exalted Ruler with the consent of a majority of the Board of Grand Trustees," the Statute states.


