

Well the New Year is upon us and with the virus still lurking we still can't do much with the veterans. Most veterans will start to get the vaccine. My nephew is a doctor at James A. Haley and called me this morning asking if I had got mine yet. I told him "no" but i'm sure it won't be too long. He mentioned that the nursing home part has already started receiving theirs.

I want to bring up a subject that no one likes to talk about but it is important for veterans to know. Burial Benefits for veterans: The va will pay \$796 toward burial and funeral expenses for deaths on or after October 1, 2019 (if hospitalized by VA at time of death),or \$300 toward burial and funeral expenses (if not hospitalized by va at the time of death)and a plot-interment allowance of \$796 (if not buried in a National Cemetery). You can visit vetsburialbenefits.com for more information. None of us are getting any younger and we need to take advantage of what we are entitled too as veterans.

If you are a donor on your drivers license and call (727) 344-6551 and let one of the secretaries know the Elks have a program for that also. Also clothes donations are needed especially good used jackets. As always, it would be nice also to see more Elks at our meetings.




